Press Release: International Women's Day 2024



A Call for Investment & Recognition of Illiterate Women

¹Since 28th February 1909, when the then-active Socialist Party of America celebrated the first National Woman's Day in commemoration of the 15,000 women who protested in New York against harsh working conditions and lesser wages. In 1910, Clara Zetkin, a women's rights advocate and the leader of Germany's Women's Office for the Social Democratic Party, proposed the idea of a global International Women's Day. On 19 March 1911, the first International Women's Day was held, with more than 1 million people in Austria, Denmark, Germany, and Switzerland taking part. It took until 1975 for the United Nations to recognize and begin celebrating International Women's Day (IWD). Since then, the UN has served as the major sponsor of the yearly event, encouraging more countries to recognize "acts of courage and resolve by ordinary women who have played an outstanding role in the history of their countries and communities."
